

Ricky Gervais' special, "SuperNature", was just released on Netflix and includes several jokes about the
trans community. There are also pointed barbs about fat
people, thin people, rich people, poor people, straight
people, gay people, and every other imaginable group of
people. Gervais says of the trans community, "They just
want to be treated equally. I agree—that's why I include
them." Some of his jokes certainly made me cringe. But
I wondered—was I cringing about what Gervais said,
or what it triggered in me? Humor should hold up a
mirror to society. When a comedian makes you think
about your own failings, they have done their job. Of
course, not every comic is for every person. I suspect
many people who are criticizing Gervais' special have
not even seen it.

I felt the same way about people criticizing Dave Chappelle. So I was not surprised when many fans expressed outrage when John Mulaney surprised them with Chappelle as his opening act in Columbus, Ohio (where Dave lives). I don't know Mulaney, but he's had a helluva year. He left his wife and went public about his addictions, and connected with Olivia Munn—someone I've met numerous times yet can never quite place. But any comedian who has the chance (and the balls) to follow Chappelle onstage is fearless. I totally understand that some members of the audience felt ambushed having to sit through Chappelle. Trust me, I felt the same way when Wild Orchid opened for Cher! But just do what I did—put on your earplugs, go to the concession stand, and get drunk.

Last week, I told you all about the shows I saw on Broadway. While I was watching Patti LuPone in "Company", I thought what an interesting Martha she would be in "Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?". Instead, I saw Calista Flockhart attempt the role at the Geffen Playhouse in Los Angeles. From her first entrance, I was distracted by her striking resemblance to the late Lee Remick. No longer is Calista the clothes hanger we remember. She is now a multi-lavered, multidimensional, fuller figured (or padded) woman. That she isn't an ideal Martha is unsurprising. But she is eminently competent-high praise given my expectations. I would even venture to say that her first two acts were good...in their own way. She's more bossy than blousy; more coquettish than cantankerous; more mischievous than malevolent. All valid choices. That it fell apart in the last act was not unexpected, but jarring nonetheless. She simply could not sustain her intention. Her partner, Zachary Quinto, was so low-key (even for him) that the first two acts dragged. His last act had some juice. He was coming up, Calista was coming down, and they never intersected long enough to save the show. One is almost grateful that these actors are somewhat young for their roles (although not chronologically) and they each have a good 10-20 years left to try them again.

Which leads to news of seismic proportions. Last week, some footage fell in my hands that gives readers the rare chance to see limited portions of these performances from the comfort of their own home. Not only are scenes from "Who's Afraid of Ally McBeal?" available for your viewing pleasure, but also some exclusive footage of Pamela Anderson in "Chicago". Check them out on BillyMasters.com.

I first became aware of Moore when she hosted a summer replacement variety show with Clifton Davis. Around that time, I often heard "This Is It" and "Lean on Me" on the radio. So, imagine my excitement when I learned Melba has a new album out called "Imagine". Then I heard she was

To add insult to injury, Spacey's brother Randy Fowler made a statement: "It's not surprising to me that eventually they would've gathered enough evidence to pursue the four charges against him-I think the reckoning is going to happen.

Our thoughts go out to Leslie Jordan, who is mourning the passing of his mother. How fortunate that he spent most of the pandemic in Chattanooga with his family—a lovely silver lining. On the positive side, FOX just renewed "Call Me Kat", which stars Leslie alongside Mayim Bialik and Cheyenne Jackson. It's really grown on me, so I'm thrilled it will be back for a third season.

While I'm making confessions, and I can't believe I'm going to say this—Renée Zellweger was fantastic in "The Thing About Pam". What a great performance and a complete physical transformation. 

The fog of domestic terrorism

The far right's descent into sacralizing guns

"The Broadway company of [Phantom of the Opera]," reported CTI Newsletter in April 2013, "uses six City Theatrical SS6000 Dry Ice Foggers which are finishing their second decade on the show." I wonder if the folks in the orchestra pit at the Majestic Theatre are adversely affected by the fog pouring over them. If they catch cold, it's the price we pay for a theatrical effect.

Republicans generate a fog of misdirection and obfuscation to prevent action to rid American streets of assault weapons. Murdered schoolchildren are the price we pay for GOP legislators in thrall to the gun lobby brazenly ignoring the "well-ordered militia" clause at the beginning of the 2nd Amendment. The Founders were protecting state militias (which were used to quell slave revolts), not individuals amassing personal arsenals. Furthermore, 18th century muskets bore no resemblance to modern semi-automatic

Isn't it odd how the textualists on the Supreme Court ignore the text of the Constitution when

it suits them? Isn't it strange how the National Rifle Association cannot distinguish hunting rifles from AR-15s with 30-round (or more) magazines? Is there a drive-by hunting craze I'm unaware of that involves moving down entire herds of deer? That would hardly be sporting.

But who are we to question? The sound of gunfire has become the music of the night, or at least of fourth-grade math. One girl trapped with the gunman in a classroom at Robb Elementary School called 911 with her teacher's phone after the teacher was fatally shot.

The Phantom of the NRA is here inside your mind. The professedly pro-life MAGA crowd appears not so much pleased by the death toll as indifferent to it. They've gone from "Every sperm is sacred" to "Every gun is sacred."

When Beto O'Rourke crashed Texas Gov. Greg Abbott's news conference on the school shooting in Uvalde, everyone quoted by Fox News was mad at Beto. Apparently his telling Abbott "It's on you" for weakening gun laws was inexcusable.

When will it be the right time to discuss ending this senseless carnage? How is it political for Beto to discuss it but it's not political for Gov. Abbott and other Republicans to blame every mass shooting on mental health problems? There are many mentally ill people on the streets of my city; they are among the least violent people I have encountered. How can the proliferation of assault weapons not be at least part of the problem? Why the vehement, wall-to-wall denial of that obvious factor? To the extent that mental illness is a factor and not an evasion, why do the same Republicans oppose mental health funding?

Elie Mystal of The Nation tweeted on May 26, "[W]hite Republicans are not interested in solving problems, they're interested in creating pretextual excuses to absolve them from having to solve problems."

To be fair, I should note that Sen. Ted Cruz suggests locking every school entrance but one and posting a cop there. Can you say fire code violation?

Even if we hire a phalanx of police to guard every school door, what's to prevent them from acting like the cops in Uvalde who reportedly waited an hour outside the school, tackling parents rather than going after the gunman?

Inevitably, right-wing sources spread a false

claim that the shooter was a transgender person. One terrified trans girl was set upon by four men who blamed the trans community; one called her "a mental health freak." Imagine the courage it takes to remain true to yourself despite being the nation's favorite scapegoat.

Two Democratic U.S. senators out of fifty refuse to change the filibuster rule to allow passage of gun safety legislation. On the Republican side is a solid wall of opposition. Pundits, determined to blame both sides for a lopsided problem, turn this into "Congress refuses to act." Many people use this as an excuse not to vote, which helps Republicans win.

If we ban assault weapons and conduct a buyback program, lives will be saved. It won't solve everything, no. All-or-nothing approaches perpetuate grievances rather than getting anything done. But an assault weapons ban will lower the death toll. It did before.

It ought to be clear by now that we cannot shoot our way out of this problem. We can stop the maybem and misery only if enough of us see through the fog of Republican disinformation and vote in unprecedented numbers to send them packing.





A Joyous Misbehavin'

Ain't Misbehavin',

Nora Theatre at Central Square Theater, Front Porch Arts Collective and Greater Boston Square Company. Seen at Central Square Theater; June 9-26 at GBSC. gbsc.org

Thomas Wright Waller accomplished a lot as both a composer and performer during his far too short life (39, from pneumonia in 1943). Best known as "Fats," the multi-talented musician (piano, organ and other instruments) established the Harlem Stride piano style, wrote well over 400 songs and influenced such modern jazz pianists as Errol Garner and Count Basie. The internationally busy performer was also known to flavor his performances with humor. Richard Maltby, Jr. and Murray Horwitz beautifully captured Waller's world in their snappy tribute show "Ain't Misbehavin'-The Fats Waller Musical." Now a kind of theater triumvirate-Nora Theatre, The Front Porch Arts Collective and the Greater Boston Stage Company -is bringing fresh and high-stepping expression to the deserving 1978 Tony Award winner.

Under the smart guidance of Front Porch co-producing artistic director Maurice Emmanuel Parent—himself a gifted actor (Norton and IRNE Awards) and multi-talent, the current revival beautifully evokes the jazzy ambience of this revue. Designer Elisabetta Polito has dressed the two men in sharp period suits and the three women in colorful evening wear. At the same time art deco band identifiers precede the upstage musicians, with the piano at stage left. Large wall murals by Harlem Renaissance painter Archibald Motley Jr. encase the cabaret setting with vivid images of enthusiastic aficionados.

The talented quinter are equally enthusiastic—both on the ample selection of Waller classics and songs not written by Waller but recorded by him (all thoroughly identified in the playbill song list). Anthony Pires, Jr. captures the trademark Waller humor that enriches many numbers and makes the most of the devilishly suggestive Andy Razaf lyrics on "Honeysuckle Rose." Lovely Hoffman brings plaintive drama to "Mean to Me." Big-voiced Sheree Marcelle (who alternates with Becky Bass) delivers "That Ain't Right" with riveting forcefulness. Kira Sarai Helper (who sometimes substitutes for Christina Jones) proves very expressive on "I've Got My Fingers Crossed" in the fast-paced five-number finale.

Remarkably agile Jackson Jirard amazes with the stylish and quick moves of a Bojangles and even mid-air splits. His sardonic phrasing and wonderful clusiveness make "The Viper's Drag" an eye-catching stand-out and stamps this charismatic performer as a large talent with a big future. Parent's snappy choreography (with cochoreography by llyse Robbins) keeps the per-

formers' moves as expressive as their renditions. Throughout the versatile band members—under pianist-conductor Catherine Scornetta (subbing for co-music directors David Freeman Coleman and Dan Rodriguez)—capture the diverse demands of both Waller's repertoire and the other material he recorded.

If the Waller musical largely comes across as light-hearted and free-wheeling—particularly the strongly choreographed first act-closing winner "The Joint Is Jumpin," the second act-finale closer "Black and Blue" serves as a timely remind-

er of the pain that African-Americans suffered (and in sometimes subtler ways continue to suffer) at the hands of racists. The first-rate quinter builds this iconic number from a kind of subdued sadness to a powerfully full-voiced harmony.

Parent, in his playbill notes, points to this show as a rarity asking performers "to embody joy and freedom onstage in response to the racial oppression that songs like "Black and Blue" point to." This collaborative revival of "Ain't Misbehavin" so joyously celebrates Waller's genius that audiences will want to dance in their seats.

In the Wake of Tragedy, Again

This was going to be a very different column. Then 19 children and two adults were shot and killed by a gunman at an elementary school in Uvalde, Texas.

As I started composing this column in my head, something about those two sentences made me pause. I then realized they were nearly identical to what I'd written almost a decade ago when 20 children and six adults were killed by a gunman at an elementary school in Newtown, Connecticut. Have we learned nothing as a nation about protecting our children since then? Apparently not.

The unconscionable shooting at the mostly Latinx Robb Elementary School in Uvalde, Texas, comes just weeks after 10 Black people died in a shooting in Buffalo. And while the victims of any shooting are someone's children, when the victims are young children, their deaths hit me-and I'm sure many others-like a gut punch. School shootings have been one of my main fears as a parent and remain so, even though my son is grown. My heart breaks for the families of the victims and for the children who survived but will have to grapple with ongoing fear and trauma.

In 2022 so far, there have been at least 77 incidents of gunfire on school grounds in the

U.S. (six in Texas), resulting in 14 deaths and 45 injuries, reports Everytown for Gun Safety, the largest gun violence prevention organization in the country. The first half of the 2021-2022 school year was the deadliest in recent history. they say. "Deadly" and "school year" in the same sentence-consider how horrifying that is.

As a society, we give much lip service to doing things "in the best interests of the children." Repeated mass murders of children, over decades, are as far from their best interests as one can get. The right-wing, which has done nothing to further gun control, nevertheless has wielded a "best interests of the children" argument against LGBTQ parents and LGBTQ kids (particularly transgender ones). It claims to care about the lives of fetuses but will do nothing to protect children from gun violence after they are born. There is something deeply wrong with that ideology.

A country has failed its citizens when it cares less about protecting them and more about allowing them access to firearms-particularly semi-automatic weapons like those used in Newtown, Buffalo, Uvalde, and many other mass shootings. Gun control is only part of the solution-the Buffalo shooting, for example, underscored the continuing need for increased action

against White supremacy and racism-but it is a key step. We need stronger background checks and bans on the sale of semi-automatic rifles and high-capacity magazines, among other restrictions. (And no, armed guards, much less armed teachers, in schools is not an alternate solution. Studies have shown this is not effective and there are high risks of hitting a child rather than an attacker during a chaotic and stressful situation. See Valerie Strauss' piece in the Washington Post, 5/25/2022.)

I write this on the cusp of Pride Month-the original subject of this column. Pride has come to be a time of celebration-but this year, it feels wise to remember its roots as a protest. LGBTQ equality is facing some of its biggest challenges since the marriage equality battle, with a surge of anti-LGBTQ, particularly anti-trans, legislation around the country. Reproductive rights are under attack, impacting both queer and non-queer people. And gun violence continues to rise. No one is immune from gun violence in the U.S., but for those of us in marginalized communities that have been targeted by such violence because of our identities-LGBTO people, people of color, and Jews, among others-the fear and the need for change may feel even more pressing, bound up with our other work towards social justice.

I therefore hope you'll consider joining one of the "March for Our Lives" protests across the country on June 11 in support of stricter gun control. (See marchforourlives.com.) Please also call or write to your elected officials about this issue, and make gun control a factor when you vote. Support organizations working for gun control; donate if you can and help elevate their messages regardless.

For those looking for ways to help young children process their feelings around this latest shooting or around ongoing active shooter drills in their schools, I recommend Sesame Street's resources-visit sesamestreetincommunities. org and search for "gun violence." Additionally, publisher A Kids Company About is making their "A Kids Book About School Shootings" downloadable free at akidsco.com. Written by a survivor of the 1999 Columbine High School shooting, it is aimed at ages 5 to 9.

And for people who need it, the Disaster Distress Helpline, 1.800.985.5990, is a 24/7, 365-day-a-year, national hotline with immediate crisis counseling for people experiencing emotional distress related to any natural or human-caused disaster.

I'd like to say I have hope that things will change, but I said the same after Columbine, and after Newtown, and after all the other shootings. In the absence of much hope that we will see change anytime soon, I find myself turning for strength to a saying from my Jewish tradition, "You are not obligated to complete the work, but neither are you free to desist from it." We must resist, persist, and not desist. We owe it to our children.


